

The Journey to the Cross Leads us to Freedom

It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. Galatians 5.1

Lent is a call to inner liberation that can touch each person deeply. On Ash Wednesday we begin the journey towards the cross with a call to practice the exercise of prayer, fasting, prayer and generosity. And, although the call to practice these disciplines seems to be very far from being fulfilled; By receiving the ashes we have been invited to humility and conversion: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return", which means to delve deeper into our lives and deepen our faith.

Praying allows us to enter the depth of ourselves to find God again. Fasting is placing oneself freely in the face of spontaneous and apparently insatiable desires. And sharing our gifts helps us understand that we must resist the desire for power and possession in favor of generosity. It is not, therefore, in any way about complying with an external formalism. On the contrary, it is the path that makes us progress in interior freedom and brings us closer to Christ.

The entire Lent is oriented towards freedom as a fruit of the practice of the gospel. Moses' liberation of the people of the Old Alliance is nothing more than a sample of what Christ has prepared for us, freeing all humanity through his cross and resurrection from the slavery of sin and death.

The journey to the cross prepares us to have this experience of faith and forces us to become aware of the obstacles and burdens that chain our freedom. Christ with his light makes us see them, and with his power he lifts us up and makes us walk alongside him. Because although Christ is the one who sets us free; Freedom must be achieved by being willing to do our part as Christians.

We have forty days to train and receive the gift of freedom, to break chains, to update our intimacy with God, to make Jesus Christ occupy the center of our lives, to adjust all levels of faith, hope and charity.

We have forty days to set ourselves free with the help of God. I encourage you, therefore, to live this time of reflection by participating in the acts of piety of prayer, fasting and generosity. to read the gospel daily; to participate in worship services, to participate in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper; I invite you to meet again and reconcile with your Lord.

Celebrating Lent and Easter is an opportunity for each believer to renew his faith and consequently his life. DON'T miss this opportunity and come and rejoice in the Lord.

SPRC-Safe Sanctuary

Annual conferences often require churches to have written safety policies. One example of these policies is a written "Safe Sanctuary" policy related to risk management with children, youth, and vulnerable adults. From January to September 2023 the SPRC worked on developing its "Safe Sanctuary" policy. We have based our policy on the format suggested by the church conference for small congregations. The policy has been reviewed by the SPRC and the Ad Council and edited several times. We then presented the revised policy to the Ad Council which approved it in September of 2023. A one-page summary of this policy is included in this February newsletter. Safe Sanctuary Policy Summary

Congregational Covenant and Adoption

The Viroqua United Methodist Church's purpose for establishing this Child, Youth, and Vulnerable Person Protection Policy and accompanying procedures is to demonstrate our total and unwavering commitment to the physical well-being, emotional safety, and spiritual growth of all our children, youth, and vulnerable people.

We adopt this policy in accordance with the statement we as a congregation make at each baptism that we will "nurture children and youth in the Christian faith and life and include them in our care." With this policy we renew our baptismal pledge to "live according to the example of Christ" and surround children, youth and other vulnerable people with a "community of love and forgiveness, that they may grow in their trust of God and be thus confirmed and strengthened in a way that leads to eternal life." (Baptismal Covenant II, *United Methodist Book of Worship*, p. 96)

This policy coordinates and supersedes the previous policies used by Viroqua United Methodist Church.

As a Christian community of faith and a United Methodist congregation, we are committed to conduct the ministry of the gospel in ways that assure the safety and spiritual growth of all our children, youth, and vulnerable people, as well as all the workers with children, youth, and vulnerable people. By this policy and its accompanying procedures, we implement prudent operational procedures in all programs and events.

- A. **Training:** The Viroqua United Methodist Church through its SPRC will provide training on this policy and its procedures to assure that adults involved in activities with children, youth, and vulnerable people are aware of these standards and will abide by them.
- B. **Screening:** All volunteers and staff who have direct involvement with activities covered by this policy will be screened in accordance with Southwest Wisconsin Annual Conference policy. All people who are subject to this policy will be rescreened at least every three years.
- C. **Supervision:** All activities covered by this policy and its procedures will be supervised by the appropriate number of screened adults.

Conclusion

In all our ministries with children, youth, and vulnerable people, the Viroqua United Methodist Church is committed to demonstrating the love of Jesus Christ so that each of God's children here will be "surrounded by steadfast love, established in the faith, and confirmed and strengthened in the way that leads to life eternal." (Baptismal Covenant 2, *United Methodist Hymnal*, p.44)

It was also commented that the activities during OMW were really fun, and everyone also enjoyed the Bible trivia and discussion questions on the tables. There was discussion surrounding the offering collected at OMW as well as Adult Sunday School, as well as teaching the children the importance of giving their time, talents, and tithes to the church. At present, Adult Sunday School offering gets placed in the general offering and OMW offering is held in a fund to purchase Christmas Gifts for needy families. Part of the new policy requires that anyone who will be working with children in a situation where there is only one adult present needs to pass a background check. Erika recently had a background check done for Conference, so she does not believe another is necessary. Heidi, Janette, & Joanne all have to have background checks run frequently for work & volunteer positions. Do we need to spend the money to re-run these people? It was decided to recommend that Kathy and Avis have background checks performed, as they are the only members of the committee that have not recently had one.

Youth Winter Activity

We scheduled several Winter Activities for the youth & anyone else who would like to join us! Wednesday, January 31st @ 5:30 will be a movie night. We will be having a light meal & watching the movie "The Journey to Bethlehem" starring Antonio Banderas. Sunday, February 11th, we will be joining Westby UMC at Living Water Bible Camp for their annual Winter Fun Days. And Feb 24th we will be traveling to Fort McCoy to go snow tubing at Whitetail Ridge. More information will be released as we get closer to each date.


