Present: Richard & Imgrad Allen, Tim Gaskell, Tom & Sharon Sharratt, Lois Gerling, Jean Shore, Donna Perkins, Julie Fargen, Pastor Erika, Kelly & Jill Bjornstad, Verna Drake and Linda Weilnau **Opening:** Tim Gaskell opened with prayer.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the February board meeting were emailed to the board and published in the March newsletter, so they could be reviewed prior to the meeting. Jean Shore and Kelly Bjornstad motioned to approve the minutes. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Verna Drake provided the financial reports for February. These reports were emailed to the board members prior to the meeting. We are now paying quarterly for the multiperil insurance. Jean Shore and Kelly Bjornstad motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Motion passed.

Old Business:

- Review COVID Policy It was decided to continue with the policy of masks being optional. We will remove this item from the future agendas and add it back if we feel there is a need.
- Meal Site Contract Received payment? We have not received the payment yet. Tim Gaskell will inquire as to when we can expect the payment.
- ✤ Safe Sanctuary Policy Progress? Tim Gaskell said it is still in progress.
- Switch Pastor's Office & Library Progress? Lois Gerling, Jane Gaskell and Verna Drake have sorted through most of the items in the library. The books we feel aren't needed anymore will be given away.
- Food Drive Need people to take the food to the Cashton Cupboard and Bethel Butikk after Easter. –
 Verna Drake volunteered to take the food donations to Bethel Butikk. Kelly and Jill Bjornstad
 volunteered to take the food donations to the Cashton Cupboard.
- Dishwasher & Possible Grant We will not need a grant, due to receiving donations for this project.
 Fred Fronk will be able to install a Bosch dishwasher, a new faucet for the island sink, and make some adjustments to the island so the dishwasher can be installed there. The cost for this project, which includes the cost of the dishwasher will be about \$1540. Mr. Fronk estimated that he could get this project completed in about a month.
- West Entrance Modification Update? B&W Concrete will be doing this project. We are waiting for them to come and review what we would like to have done. Verna Drake will contact them for an update.

New Business:

- ✤ Statistical Report Has it been submitted? Verna Drake submitted this report.
- Chili Cook-Off Prize Do we want to do anything special with this money? We received \$332 for 1st place. It was decided to have this money go towards the west entrance ramp modification.

- Burgers in the Park We will do this again as a fundraiser and to be out in the community. Verna Drake signed our church up to do Burgers in the Park on Thursday, July 18, 2024. Verna will see if she can find someone to perform during this time.
- Financial Audit & Property Tax Exempt Form The financial audit is in process. Verna Drake gave the information to Lois Gerling. Lois will work with Maranda Oliver to complete the audit. Verna has the property tax exempt form ready and will submit it by the end of March.
- ✤ Youth Verna Drake suggested that we start attending events our high school youth are in, so we can be more visible in their lives and show them that we care about them.
- BSF (Bible Study Fellowship) Verna Drake was wondering if we might be interested in having our church as a satellite location for this group. They would provide the leader and the group usually meets 1 day/night a week. They meet between September-May. They are currently studying the book of Revelations. Verna will check into this for more details.
- ✤ Computer in the Office Verna Drake plans on putting a small desk in the new pastor's office and put her old desktop computer in there. This computer is used for the church financials, so it makes sense to have it at the church.

Business from Board Committees:

- Trustees Urinal repair for men's restroom? Tom Sharratt talked to a plumber and is getting an estimate. Verna Drake said that Fred Fronk is going to fix the drawer that is stuck in the kitchen. Mr. Fronk said he could change the lighting in the kitchen to LEDs for about \$1000. We still need to paint the peaks outside on the west side, above the kitchen/storage rooms. Kelly Bjornstad will replace the bad tubes in the kitchen lights.
- SPRC Pastor Erika has requested to take a vacation April 5-12. We will need a substitute speaker for April 7th. Verna Drake and Julie Fargen will be meeting with Pastor Erika for review of how things are going.
- ✤ Worship The joint Maudy Thursday service will be at Viroqua UMC. They will serve a loaded baked potato meal at 6:00 PM with the service following the meal. They would like Westby UMC to provide cubed ham for this meal. Verna Drake will take care of this and use church funds to purchase the ham.
- Education Ashlynn Davidson substituted for Jane Gaskell during Sunday school on March 3rd. It was suggested to possibly have Ashlynn teach once a month. This would give Jane a break and provide a way for Ashlynn to help.
- ✤ Lay Leadership No report available.
- ✤ Missions No report available.

Pastor's Report: On March 19 & 20, Pastor Erika and Verna Drake will go to Sun Prairie to participate in classes for the Institute of Congregational Development.
