Plan to Rebuild

"By night I went out through the Valley Gate toward the Jackal Well and the Dung Gate, examining the walls of Jerusalem, which had been broken down, and its gates, which had been destroyed by fire." ~ Nehemiah 2.13

The story of Nehemiah may not be one of the best known in the Bible, but it is a great story. It's about a man who loved his God, and his people. Nehemiah courageously spoke the truth, stood firm in the face of opposition, and faithfully carried out... an incredible task!

Nehemiah, who is cupbearer to King Artaxerxes of Babylon, learns how devastated the city of Jerusalem is. So, he has in his heart the desire to go to the city and do what is necessary to rebuild the city. Nehemiah is able to recognize both the problem and the solution, even though he had never been to Jerusalem. He has an incredible vision of what he wants and what he expects.

What is also incredible is that the town only needed 52 days to rebuild the city wall that had been in ruins for over 120 years! And they were able to do it thanks to his determination, but also to the leadership and the clear planning that they had to follow. Nehemiah took the time necessary, so that he and his people were ready.

- 1. HE IDENTIFYED THE PROBLEM The first thing Nehemiah did was inquire about the situation of the Jews, and the wall around Jerusalem. When he found out that the wall was still in ruins, and that the name of God was being mocked, he identified with the feelings of the people, with their needs, and committed himself to the cause. The people's problem became his problem.
- 2. SPENT TIME IN PRAYER Almost immediately, Nehemiah got on his knees to pray. After praying, he asked God for the favor. Without a doubt, he received the vision and the plan to rebuild the wall, during his times of communion with God.

- 3. APPROACH THOSE OF GREAT INFLUENCE In any leadership endeavor, people of influence "can make or break" the entire project. In this case, it was the Persian king Artaxerxes. Nehemiah received from him not only permission to rebuild the wall, but also the necessary resources and support. No doubt, Nehemiah also chose key people to go with him.
- 4. EVALUATED THE SITUATION When Nehemiah finally arrived in Jerusalem, he inspected, for himself, the challenge he was facing. He did it quietly, at night, personally inspecting the damage, and planning the project without interference from anyone.
- 5. HE MET WITH THE PEOPLE AND PRESENTED THE VISION He spoke with the people, the priests, the nobles, the officials, and the people who did the work. He described to them his vision of rebuilding the wall, and the spiritual ramifications of the project.
- 6. HE ENCOURAGED THEM WITH PAST SUCCESSES With such a daunting task as rebuilding the wall, Nehemiah knew he needed to encourage the people. So, he told them the great help which God had given him, and what the king had told him.
- 7. HE RECEIVED THE APPROVAL OF THE PEOPLE Once Nehemiah presented his plan, the people committed to being part of the reconstruction process. Each and every one committed to doing their part and without fear, they prepared to work for the good of all.

Once Nehemiah saw the need of his people and the devastation of the city, he could not be calm and live his life indifferently, so he sought to be aware of the situation and prayed to God. While Nehemiah waited for God's response, which took 4 months to arrive, he dedicated himself to designing a plan to be ready when God gave him his answer.

Nothing Nehemiah did was improvised, he had a clear vision and concrete objectives of what he needed to do and each step to take in order to rebuild the city walls. It is true that obstacles were presented during the process and during the reconstruction, but Nehemiah always turned to God in prayer, in addition to always keeping the objective in mind and relying on the people.

At this critical moment, God calls us to be part of the process of reconstruction and renewal of our church, for them we must have a clear and well-defined purpose of what we want for our future. The Book of Nehemiah teaches us about the type of leadership necessary and about the planning and rebuilding process we should consider to be the Church we have been called to be.

Westby United Methodist Church – Board Meeting & April 10, 2024

Present: Ardith Hoff, Julie Fargen, Jean Shore, Jane Gaskell, Tim Gaskell and Linda Weilnau **Opening:** Jane Gaskell opened with prayer.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes of the March board meeting were emailed to the board and published in the April newsletter, so they could be reviewed prior to the meeting. Jean Shore and Ardith Hoff motioned to approve the minutes. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Verna Drake provided the financial reports for March. These reports were emailed to the board members prior to the meeting. Verna Drake asked if we should pay \$349 or 10% of the March offering for the March apportionments. Ardith Hoff and Jean Shore motioned to pay \$349 for the March apportionments. Motion passed. We will discuss the apportionment payments more at the May board meeting when Verna will be available to provide more information. Ardith Hoff and Jean Shore motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Motion passed.

Old Business:

Switch Pastor's Office & Library – Progress? – Verna Drake moved a computer into the corner of the new office so she can do the financial tasks at the church. Bethel Butikk was able to take most of the books that we didn't need and they will give the Bibles away. The sorting of books from the library is

- finished. The next step will be to sort items in the old office. Pastor Erika could start using the new office now.
- ♣ Dishwasher Update? Jane Gaskell reported that the dishwasher may be installed by the end of April.
- ₩ West Entrance Modification Update? Verna talked with Paul Bjerkos about this. He is going to try and work us in with another job he has in Westby. He needs to look into the costs because the cost will be determined by how the entrance is adjusted to change it into a sloped approach.

New Business:

- Church Cleaning Possible date of May 4th after 10:30 AM? It was decided to do the church cleaning on Saturday, May 4th and start at 9:00 AM.
- Congregational Development Set a meeting date to discuss with our congregation? The next joint meeting with Viroqua is April 29th at 6:00 PM at Viroqua UMC. We will set a date at the May board meeting to discuss the information we have received about congregational development with our congregation. It was decided to do this during fellowship time one Sunday.
- May Day Flowers for Norseland It was decided to plant the flowers in plastic cups on Sunday, April 28th during fellowship time. We will need at least 48 marigolds. Julie Fargen will purchase the flowers. Jane Gaskell will purchase the plastic cups and Linda Weilnau will provide the dirt.
- ♣ Craft Workshop in May Possibly making steppingstones and/or make decorated clay flowerpots. Possible dates are May 6, 9 or 22 with a start time of 5:00 PM. – It was decided to do the decorated clay flowerpot workshop on Thursday, May 9th at 5:00 PM.
- Raise the Payment for Mowing Church Yard Raise from \$25 to \$30 since Connor also whacks the weeds? Jane Gaskell and Ardith Hoff motioned to increase the payment for mowing to \$30. Motion passed.
- Self-Guided Scripture Tour during Burgers in the Park If we do this, it may be helpful to offer a buddy system for some people who may not feel comfortable walking on the hilly areas and bumpy ground of the park. We decided that this would be a good activity to add to our Burgers in the Park event. Verna Drake will oversee organizing this activity.
- Use of Old Heavy Tables on May 1-5 by Verna Jane Gaskell and Jean Shore motioned to allow Verna Drake to use the tables on May 1-5. Motion passed.
- Community Worship Service July 7 at Davidson Park at 11:00 AM, followed by a potluck. Verna Drake provided information via email about this. We would join the other churches in the Westby community for a worship service centered around Christian patriotism. This community worship service used to be done annually many years ago. Verna asked several pastors from the Westby churches about starting this event again and they responded favorably. Vernal said she would be willing to organize this event. The Bethesda church has reserved the shelter for the community worship service. It was decided that this would be a good activity to participate in.

Business from Board Committees:

- Trustees Handicap Door The cover came off the door mechanism and the motor was starting to fall out. Jane Gaskell contacted Fred Fronk and he came and fixed it.
 - Men's Urinal Tom Sharratt received an estimate of \$412 from Harold Olson (plumber) to fix the urinal. There was also an estimate from Grant Johnson of \$100 to fix the drywall around the urinal. This would be done after the urinal is repaired. Ardith Hoff and Julie Fargen motioned to have the urinal fixed. Motion passed.
 - Midwest Asphalt We received a letter from this company with an estimate to have the parking lots resealed. It has been 2 years since the parking lots were resealed and painted. It was

decided to put this on the May agenda so we can determine the amount of funds that will be available after the west entrance has been modified.

- SPRC Julie Fargen reported that she and Verna Drake will be meeting with Pastor Erika sometime to discuss how Pastor Erika is doing. Julie and Verna had asked for feedback from the congregation, but they haven't received hardly any replies. Julie is going to create a questionnaire to give the congregation so they can hopefully have more feedback information to give to Pastor Erika when they meet with her, possibly in May.
- ♥ Worship Jane Gaskell reported that we finished with the Holy Week and Easter services, which went well. Thank you to Tim Gaskell who was the guest speaker on April 7 while Pastor Erika was on vacation.
- **□** Education The Sunday school class went bowling after Sunday school on Palm Sunday. Everyone had a good time bowling and eating pizza. This even took the place of the Winter Fun Day which was cancelled. The last day of Sunday school will be May 5. After Sunday school that day, there will be a Mystery Lunch for the Sunday school parents. The children will serve the meal to their parents. Jane Gaskell will be organizing this activity.
- **♣ Lay Leadership** Ardith Hoff continues to write more short articles for the website.
- ♣ Missions After some discussion, it was decided to do Compassion Gift item for the May mission of the month. This is through Compassion International. The donations collected will be used to purchase an item from the Compassion Gift catalog.
