My simple answer to this question is that denominations are developed and founded according to the needs of the world.

Many people try to understand the denomination in the context of this present day. However, there is about a 200-year gap between Lutheran/presbyterian churches and Methodists, meaning the historical context was different when each denomination was founded. Therefore, it is very important for us to know about the denomination's history and how each denomination worked for God in its context. Also, we need to apply what we have learned from each denomination in our lives.

Since I am a Methodist pastor, I hope to talk more about Methodism through the articles this year. For the first start, I brought a quote from John Wesley's article, which was written in 1786. Wesley passed away in 1791. He wrote the article, Thoughts Upon Methodism, 5 years before he died. At this time, the Methodist movement had dramatically grown up. A lot of people joined the Methodist movement, and they influenced their society a lot. As a founder of the Methodist movement, Wesley wrote the article to review the identity of Methodism in this context.

He mentioned the quote above in the very first part of his article. We can see that he was not worried about the number of people in the movement, but he was worried about Methodists who lost their Doctrine, Spirit, and Discipline.

Now, the United Methodist Church – probably not only the UMC but also all churches in the United States – is experiencing a sharp decline in the number of church members. We are worried about the decreasing membership of the United Methodist Church. However, when I was concerned about the church's challenges, I always remembered Wesley's quote and had a self-question. "Am I worrying about losing Doctrine, Spirit, and Discipline as much as decreasing the numbers of people?"

I believe it is very important for us in this present day to know and learn about Methodism because we are experiencing what Wesley said. So, in 2025, through this newsletter article, I hope to share about Methodism with you. And I hope to find the way that we should walk together as Methodists in this present day. May God give us wisdom and guidance for the blessed 2025 year.


## Mission of the Month – Cemetery Lawn Care
