

Justification by Faith

The plain condition whereof being once fulfilled, 'there is no more condemnation for us', but we are 'justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Jesus Christ'.

Justification by Faith - John Wesley

Early Methodists had their doctrine to help Methodist members become perfect Christians who love God and love their neighbors. Early Methodists' doctrine was the way to Heaven. And there were a few steps in this way to Heaven. Repentance – Justification – New Birth – Sanctification – Perfection. Among those

steps of doctrine, there were two main pillars. They were Justification and Sanctification. These doctrines of Justification and Sanctification were not new ideas that Wesley found in the Bible. Before John Wesley, the ideas of Justification and Sanctification were used by Christian theologians and the church. However, John Wesley organized the relationship between Justification and Sanctification well, and Wesley's greatest achievement was applying these two concepts to churches and ministry. John Wesley and early Methodists devoted their lives to being perfect Christians according to the Methodist doctrine. And it truly happened that they experienced Justification and Sanctification in their lives.

Then, what is Justification? In his sermon, *Justification by Faith*, Wesley said, "The plain scriptural notion of justification is pardon, the forgiveness of sins. It is that act of God the Father whereby, for the sake of the propitation made by the blood of his Son, he 'showeth forth his righteousness (or mercy) by the remission of the sins that are past'."

For easier understanding, we can simply say, Justification is that "God justifies someone as righteous." Justification is God saying, "You are righteous." Then, how can we be justified as righteous? We can be justified through the forgiveness of sins. Forgiveness of sins is the act of God that is shown to us through the sacrifice of Jesus.

Then, what is the condition to be justified? Wesley said, "I cannot describe the nature of this faith better than in the words of our own Church: 'The only instrument of salvation' (whereof justification is one branch) 'is faith: that is a sure trust and confidence that God both hath and will forgive our sins, that he hath accepted us again into his favor, for the merits of Christ's death and Passion." The only thing that we need is faith to be justified by God. It is not our moral good work, kindness, or good attitude. The only thing is the faith that we believe God forgives us and will forgive us through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

Justification by Faith is the first pillar of the doctrine of the early Methodist people. They believed that they could not save themselves by their works, but they believed Jesus is the only way to enter the life of God's presence. This is what we should learn in the present day as Methodists.

Strang's called the next day to say that they were ready to come and repair both items. Aaron will call Strang's and Pastor Paul to make arrangements for the repairs.
