# Sanctification

It is thus that we wait for entire sanctification, for a full salvation from all our sins, from pride, self-will, anger, unbelief, or, as the Apostle expresses it, 'Go on to perfection.' But what is perfection? The word has various senses: here it means perfect love. It is love excluding sin; love filling the heart, taking up the whole capacity of the soul. It is love 'rejoicing evermore, praying without ceasing, in everything giving thanks'.

*The Scripture Way of Salvation* – John Wesley

When we say about salvation, we normally just think of the relationship between sin and forgiveness of sin, or the permission that is given by Jesus's sacrifice on the cross to be in Heaven after death. This could be the part of

Justification. In early Methodists' understanding, justification was not everything of the salvation. There were another pillar of salvation, it was Sanctification. Justification is a very important matter of Salvation. However, in early Methodists' understanding, Salvation consists of justification and sanctification.

In his sermon The Scripture Way of Salvation, Wesley said, "So that the salvation which is here spoken of might be extended to the entire work of God, from the first dawning of grace in the soul till it is consummated in glory." So, in Wesley's understanding, Salvation is not just an event of a moment time, but it is the faith journey of entire life. And he understood the two main parts of Salvation were Justification and Sanctification. In his sermon, The Scripture Way of Salvation, "But we are at present concerned only with that salvation which the Apostle is directly speaking of. And this consists of two general parts, justification and sanctification."

Sanctification occurs just right after justification – in details, new birth occurs between justification and sanctification, we will look over about the new birth later. Wesley, in his sermon Justification by Faith, said, "This is sanctification; which is indeed in some degree the immediate fruit of justification, but nevertheless is a distinct gift of God, and of a totally different nature." And in sermon The Scripture Way of Salvation, he said, "And at the same time that we are justified, yea, in that very moment, sanctification begins." Both Justification and Sanctification are works of God's grace in our lives, but they are clearly distinct, and Sanctification is followed Justification. Then, what is Sanctification? What is the purpose of Sanctification? In his sermon The Scripture Way of Salvation, he said, "It is thus that we wait for entire sanctification, for a full salvation from all our sins, from pride, self-will,

anger, unbelief, or, as the Apostle expresses it, 'Go on to perfection.'" After people were justified, they should live the life of sanctification for the full salvation. Sanctification purposes to be the perfect Christian, which means to be Christians who perfectly love God and love neighbor.

Then, how can we be sanctified? Wesley mentioned in his sermon The Scripture Way of Salvation, "Faith is the condition, and the only condition of sanctification, exactly as it is of justification. It is the condition: none is sanctified but he that believes; without faith no man is sanctified. And it is the only condition: this alone is sufficient for sanctification." We are not sanctified by our work. As we are justified by faith, we are sanctified by faith. Spiritual work, such as reading the Bible, praying, and attending worship service, can help people feel the love and grace of God, but those are not the conditions of sanctification. Faith is the only thing that we need for sanctification.

John Wesley understood sanctification as a process that transforms people into Christians of perfect love. Sanctification always purposed to love God and love neighbor. Wesley's and early Methodists' understanding of sanctification is still with us, Methodists, in this present day, to help people pursue holiness in their lives.


We invite you to join us this May as we journey through eight different life areas to

#### Westby United Methodist Church – Board Meeting 🕆 - April 16, 2025

**Present:** Pastor Paul, Jean Shore, Verna Drake, Tim Gaskell, Jane Gaskell, Ardith Hoff, Julie Fargen and Linda Weilnau

**Opening:** Tim Gaskell opened with prayer.

**Approval of Minutes:** The minutes of the March board meeting were emailed to the board and published in the April newsletter, so they could be reviewed prior to the meeting. Jane Gaskell and Jean Shore motioned to approve the minutes. Motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** Verna Drake provided the financial reports for March. These reports were emailed to the board members prior to the meeting. A concern was mentioned because Viroqua UMC is always months behind in providing the pastoral charges that we owe and that we're not notified ahead of time when parsonage repairs are needed. Verna Drake is going to ask Viroqua UMC to notify us about parsonage repairs before the repairs are done. Jean Shore and Ardith Hoff motioned to approve the treasurer's report. Motion passed.

#### Old Business:

- ♥ West Entrance Modification Janzen's installed the new ramp. We will need to have the parking lot repainted because we need to move the location of the handicap parking areas. The next item for this project is to have railings installed.
- Insurance Update We received a notice that our policy with Church Mutual was cancelled on March 20, 2025. The new insurance company is Travellers. The cost is \$842 per month and our deductible was raised. Verna Drake is going to contact Travellers because we feel the pricing is too high for the size of our building.
- Food Drive Deliver food It was decided to sort and divide the food donations after the board meeting. Half of the donations will go to Bethel Butikk and the other half to the Cashton Cupboard.
- To Schedule: Cemetery Clean-Up & Yard/Flower Bed Maintenance We need 2-3 people to help rake up at the cemetery and help pick up sticks. We will do this on April 22 at 5:30 PM (rain date is April 24). Verna Drake is working with Sam Spade to schedule a time to reinstall the edging around the rock areas. Verna also purchased Round-Up to spray the weeds in the stones.
- Bethel Butikk Recognition Dinner April 21 We still need a few people to make bars and help work.
  We will move the tables on Thursday, April 17.
- Safe Sanctuary Policy Tim Gaskell provided a draft of a proposed policy. We are to review the policy and vote on it at the May board meeting.
- Burgers in the Park Update We will be doing a bake sale during Burgers in the Park and setup a prayer picket fence for people to add prayer requests to.

#### New Business:

- Door of Hope Baby Bottle Drive The Door of Hope is having a Baby Bottle Drive, asking people to put change in a container between Mother's Day and Father's Day. It was decided to have our church participate in this fundraiser. We'll add an article about this in the May newsletter.
- Syttende Mai Breakfast Sons of Norway The Sons of Norway group called to ask if they can use our church again this year for their breakfast which will be on Saturday, May 17. Verna Drake gave them the Building Use form to fill out. They want to come on Friday, May 16 to set up. It was agreed to allow them to use the fellowship hall for this event.
- Outreach Project Suggestion Linda Weilnau saw a posting on the internet about the Lasagna Love project. Pans of lasagna are made and delivered to people in need. It was suggested to possibly do this for our Sunday school families and find out if there may be other families that may benefit from this. It was decided to discuss this more in the fall and have it as a fall project.

- May Day Flowers for Norseland? We need to ask Norseland if the flowers are well received. Jane Gaskell will call Norseland to find out how many residents they currently have. If we do this project, we'll plant the flowers after church on Sunday, April 27. Jane still has cups leftover from last year. Verna Drake said she will purchase flowers (marigolds) and dirt.
- May Agenda Volunteer Tim and Jane will not be able to attend the May board meeting, so we need a volunteer to create the agenda and email it out. Linda Weilnau volunteered to do this.
