

"The Scripture Way of Salvation"

(Summary of John Wesley's Sermon)

John Wesley's sermon "The Scripture Way of Salvation" explains how people are saved and grow in their faith, using simple ideas from the Bible. He focuses on Ephesians 2:8, which says, "By grace you are saved through faith." Wesley wants people to understand that salvation is a gift from God, not something we can earn by being good.

First, Wesley says that we are saved by grace. Grace means God's kindness and love that we don't deserve. We receive this grace through faith, which means trusting in Jesus Christ. Faith is not just believing with your mind—it means truly depending on Jesus in your heart.

When someone has faith, God forgives their sins. This is called justification. At the same time, God also changes their heart. This is called regeneration or being "born again." It's like starting a new life. From that point on, the person begins to live differently, wanting to please God and do what is right.

But salvation does not stop there. Wesley teaches that we are also sanctified, which means we grow to become more like Jesus. This is a lifelong journey of spiritual growth and becoming holy. God gives us the strength to turn away from sin and do good things. Wesley says that good work does not save us, but they are proof that we have real faith. If someone truly believes, they will show love, patience, peace, and other good qualities.

One special idea in Wesley's teaching is Christian perfection. This doesn't mean being perfect, like never making a mistake. Instead, it means having a heart full of love—loving God with all your heart and loving others as yourself. Wesley believed that with God's help, Christians can reach a point where they no longer have bad thoughts or selfish desires controlling them. This is also something we receive by trusting God, not by trying hard on our own.

In simple terms, Wesley says salvation is a journey. It begins when we first believe and are forgiven (justification), continues as we grow to become more like Jesus (sanctification), and can ultimately lead to a life filled with love (Christian perfection). All of this is possible only because of God's grace and love. We must always trust in God from beginning to end.

Wesley's message is that God wants to save us, change us, and fill us with God's love—and all we have to do is believe and keep trusting God.
