New Birth

We are continuing to learn about the doctrine of early Methodists. We are especially studying the Way of Salvation, which Wesley identified as essential to understanding their doctrine. I have shared that there are two main pillars in the early Methodists' view of salvation: Justification and Sanctification. Before Justification, humans go through the step of Repentance. Then, humans experience Justification, where they are assured by God that they are righteous. At the same time, or immediately after Justification, people experience the "New Birth." This New Birth is the gate and start of Sanctification.

New Birth is a very important part of the Christian life. It means being born again. John Wesley explained about New Birth in his sermon "The New Birth" well. He explains that every person must go through a spiritual change in order to be saved and have a real relationship with God. This is what Jesus meant when He said, "You must be born again" (John 3:7).

Wesley says that when we are born the first time, we are born with a sinful nature because of Adam's sin. This means we are naturally selfish, far from God, and unable to truly love or obey God. Even if someone tries to be a good person, goes to church, or follows the rules, it's not enough. A deep, inner change is needed.

The new birth is a work of God. It's something the Holy Spirit does in a person's heart. It's not something we can do by ourselves. When we are born again, God gives us a new heart. We begin to love God, want to do what is right, and live a holy life. Our thoughts, feelings, and actions start to change. This is the beginning of real Christian life.

Wesley explains that this new birth happens through faith. It's not just about believing facts about God — it's about trusting in Jesus, turning away from sin, and receiving God's grace. When this occurs, we are forgiven and also transformed.

The new birth also leads to a new way of living. A person who is born again will show love, kindness, patience, and other fruits of the Spirit. They will not be perfect, but their life will be different because God is now working in them.

Wesley warns that no one should think they are saved just because they were baptized, go to church, or try to be good. These things are not the same as being born again. Only through the new birth can we become true children of God.


